Corporate Profile / Summary of Implementation

1.1 INTRODUCTION

The Office of the Cabinet of Ministers has been established to provide support services to the Cabinet of Ministers and Cabinet Sub-Committees in the exercise of powers vested in the Cabinet of Ministers under the Constitution to direct and control the Government of the Republic.

The Secretary to the Cabinet of Ministers appointed by His Excellency the President in terms of Article 51(2)(A) of the Constitution, functions as the Head of the Office of the Cabinet of Ministers.

1.2 Vision

Being the most reliable Government agency assisting the Executive in directing the Administration of the Republic.

Mission

Assisting efficiently in the decision making process of the Cabinet of Ministers in fulfilling the duties pertaining to the direction and control of the Government of the Republic, vested with the Cabinet of Ministers in terms of Article 43(1) of the Constitution.

Objectives


Facilitating and assisting the decision making process of the Cabinet and the Cabinet Sub-Committees so that they can take informed decisions.

1.3 Main functions

- Giving instructions to Ministries pertaining to preparing Cabinet Memoranda and providing guidance to the Ministry Secretaries and Senior Officers in the said task.
- Conducting in-depth studies relating to the legal and the policy aspects of Cabinet Memoranda received and making submissions to the Cabinet of Ministers and Cabinet Sub-Committees, to facilitate coherent and proper

decision making on such Memoranda, taking into consideration all matters concerned in the discharge of functions vested with the Cabinet of Ministers in respect to policy formulation, direction and control of the Government of the Republic.

- Forwarding Cabinet Memoranda for the observations of the relevant Ministers.
- Including Cabinet Memoranda on the Agenda of the Cabinet meeting after examining the same
- Presenting Cabinet Memoranda to the Cabinet of Ministers and the Cabinet Sub-Committees to be taken up for consideration together with the relevant observations.
- Preparing Cabinet Minutes containing decisions arrived at the Cabinet meetings and Cabinet Sub-Committee meetings in all three languages and referring those Minutes to Ministers, the relevant Ministry Secretaries and other relevant authorities.
- Providing all necessary services to Cabinet Sub-Committees and Cabinet meetings.
- Conveying the decisions made by the Cabinet to the relevant Ministries.
- Review of the implementation of Cabinet decisions that need special attention.
- Fulfilling any other duties entrusted by the Hon. President and the Cabinet.

Progress and Vision

2.1 Functions pertaining to the Cabinet Meetings in the year 2022

- 2.1.1 47 Cabinet meetings were held in the year 2022. 2,214 Cabinet Memoranda have been submitted in the year 2022 from various Ministries seeking Cabinet decisions. The name list of Ministers who functioned as Members of the Cabinet in the year 2022 is indicated in Annex I. (The composition of the Cabinet of Ministers has been changed during the year 2022 in several instances) The Number of Cabinet Memoranda submitted by each Ministry to the Office of the Cabinet of Ministers in the year 2022 is shown in Annex II.
- 2.1.2 Action was taken to obtain observations from relevant Ministries pertaining to these Memoranda and action was taken by the Secretary to the Cabinet and Senior Officers to deeply analyze the legal and policy background on the said Memoranda and complications that could arise from the said proposals and briefed the Cabinet in that regard, where found necessary.
- 2.1.3 Minutes containing the decisions arrived at pertaining to the Cabinet Memoranda taken up for consideration by the Cabinet were prepared in Sinhala, Tamil and English languages by this office and submitted to the Ministers, Ministry Secretaries and other relevant institutions responsible for the implementation of the relevant decisions.

2.1.4 After conducting the Cabinet meeting, actions have been taken on the same day to prepare a Report including summaries of special Cabinet decisions such as implementation of Development Projects, Welfare Programmes, Government Procurement Activities, various Government Policies identified to be known by the public and submitted to the Hon. Ministers functioning as Co-Cabinet Spokesmen and the Director General of Information. In addition, the same information has been uploaded to the official website of the Cabinet Office on the day after the date of Cabinet meeting.

2.2 Functions pertaining to the Cabinet Sub-Committees in the year 2022

In order to facilitate the decision-making process of the Cabinet, the following Cabinet Sub-Committees were appointed by the Cabinet to submit appropriate recommendations to the Cabinet pertaining to specific areas and matters and those Sub-Committees functioned in the year 2022.

- (a) Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters
- (b) Cabinet Sub-Committee on Public Expenditure Management

(a) Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters

The following powers pertaining to the establishment matters have been entrusted with the Cabinet as per the Constitution:

- Making provisions pertaining to the policy matters of public officers including appointment of public officers, promotion, transfer, disciplinary control and dismissal (paragraph (1) of Article 55)
- appointment of Heads of Department, promotion, transfer, disciplinary control and dismissal (paragraph (2) of Article 55)

Analyzing the Memoranda submitted by Ministries in depth and submit recommendations to the Cabinet in order to facilitate the Cabinet to arrive at the most appropriate decision in implementing the aforesaid powers is the role of the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters. In addition, the responsibility of examining the relevant Cabinet Memoranda to obtain approval for Annual Performance Reports and Financial Statements of Ministries, Departments, Public Enterprises and Statutory Institutions to be tabled in Parliament and submitting recommendations in that regard has also been vested with the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters.

The composition of the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters which functioned in the year 2022 is indicated in Annex III. (The composition of this Cabinet Sub-Committee has been changed during the year 2022 in several instances)

Immediately after receiving the Cabinet Memoranda pertaining to the appointment of Heads of Department, in this office, Reports will be called from the Appointing Authority and the Administrative Authority relevant to the service to which the said officers belong on whether disciplinary action has been taken or contemplated with regard to the recommended officers.

293 Cabinet Memoranda related to the scope of the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters have been received from various Ministries in the year 2022 and 18 meetings of the Cabinet Sub- Committee on Establishment Matters have been held to take up for discussion of the said Memoranda. Action has been taken to submit the recommendations of the said Sub-Committee thereafter to the Cabinet.

A Committee comprising of the following officers assisted the Cabinet Sub-Committee and 18 meetings were held with the participation of said Officials Committee.

Officials' Committee which assisted the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters

- i. Secretary to the Cabinet of Ministers (Secretary/Convener to the Cabinet Sub-committee)
- ii. Secretary to the Prime Minister or a Senior Officer of the Prime Minister's Office nominated by him
- iii. Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration, Home Affairs, Provincial Councils and Local Government
- iv. Secretary to the Treasury or a Deputy Secretary to the Treasury nominated by him
- v. A senior officer of the Presidential Secretariat nominated by the Secretary to the President
- vi. Director General of National Budget
- vii. Director General of the Department of Management Services
- viii. Director General of Combined Services
- ix. Director General of Establishments

Further, action was taken to obtain recommendations of the Public Service Commission and the National Pay Commission on certain matters where necessary. The Cabinet having considered the recommendations submitted by the Cabinet Sub-Committee, has granted its decisions pertaining to the above 293 Cabinet Memoranda and the Office of the Cabinet of Ministers has submitted the said decisions to the relevant Ministry Secretaries and other relevant institutions for implementation.

In the year 2022, the Cabinet has taken decisions pertaining to the appointment of fifty four (54) Heads of Department and the Secretary to the Cabinet has issued Letters of Appointment in that regard.

(b) Cabinet Sub-Committee on Public Expenditure Management

15 meetings of the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Public Expenditure Management which was appointed at the Cabinet meeting held on 2020-11-30, were held in the year 2022. The Secretary to the Cabinet functioned as a member of the Senior Officials' Committee appointed to assist the said Sub-Committee. The composition of the said Sub-Committee from 08-08-2022 to 31-12-2022 is as indicated in Annex - IV. (The composition of this Cabinet Sub-Committee has been changed during the year 2022 in several instances)

- i. Secretary to the President

2.3 Special duties performed in the year 2022

2.3.1 The Secretary to the Cabinet functioned as the Chairman of the Officials' Committee assisting the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters and as a member of the Officials' Committee assisting the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Public Expenditure Management.

2.3.2 Measures were taken to implement the provisions of the Right to Information Act No. 12 of 2016 in relation to the Cabinet Office from 2017-02-03, the date on which said Act came into effect and the same continued under the said Act in the year 2022 as well. The Secretary to the Cabinet and a Senior Assistant Secretary of this office functioned as the 'Designated Officer' and the 'Information Officer' respectively during the year. Steps were taken to upload information on the official website with regard to the manner in which the documents and linked information related to this office could be accessed and the relevant applications and specimen and other relevant information related to that. 95 applications for Request for Information have been submitted to this office in the year 2022 and measures were taken to reply all the Requests for Information so received.

2.4 The uniqueness of the functions of the Office of the Cabinet of Ministers

The office of the Cabinet of Ministers has to discharge its functions deviating from the manner in which duties are normally attended to by State Institutions due to the unique nature of the functions devolved on this office. The staff of the Cabinet office has to discharge several duties as indicated below, which cannot be postponed specially due to the period permitted within two (02) weekly Cabinet meetings is only one week:

- The agenda of the weekly Cabinet meeting to be held on following Monday and the Memoranda listed therein should be forwarded to the Hon. Ministers on Wednesday of the previous week and the Minutes of the previous Cabinet meeting should be prepared in all three languages by the morning period on Thursday of the same week and forwarded via email to the Secretaries to Ministries along with Memoranda identified if any to be included in the Supplementary agenda, to be handed over to their Hon. Ministers during Friday.
- To study the matters contained in the Cabinet Memoranda intended to be listed on the Agenda of the next Cabinet meeting.
- Collection of additional information relevant to the said Cabinet Memoranda and search for the Cabinet decisions if any, previously taken in relation to the same.
- To examine the policy-wise and legal complications if any, which could arise in the implementation of the proposals in some Memoranda (by the Secretary to the Cabinet and Senior Officers).
- To obtain observations from the Ministers in charge of the relevant Ministries and further clarifications from Secretaries of the respective Ministries, pertaining to the matters contained in the Memoranda, as applicable.

In addition to the Cabinet meetings, preparation of the relevant minutes of the meetings of the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Establishment Matters and the Cabinet Sub-Committee on Public Expenditure Management, submission of the said minutes to the Cabinet for approval and dispatch of the relevant decisions relating to the said meetings to the relevant authorities, have to be attended to in each week.

In discharging the above mentioned functions, the officers serving in the Cabinet Office had to be extremely careful in maintaining confidentiality in all matters attended to by them, which is a responsibility devolved on them, and they had to work till late hours of the day after normal working hours and also during weekends and public holidays too.

Due to the above circumstances, action was taken to recruit a group of specially selected officers who could meet the requirements mentioned above and the information pertaining to the officers who served in the Cabinet Office during the year 2022 is indicated in paragraph 06 of this document.

The services of a retired Ministry Secretary serving in the post of Legal Advisor were continued to be obtained on contract basis for legal matters dealt with by the Cabinet Office.

2.5 Challengers and future objectives.

To implement the principal functions stated at 1.3 above efficiently and effectively based on the Action Plan for the year 2023.

• In terms of the Cabinet decision dated 2019-02-26 on Item No.19/Misc/(010), at the time public make requests seeking information from the Cabinet Office, on the basis of a Memorandum submitted by any Ministry after 2019-03-06, they have been guided to obtain such information directly from the Ministry from which it was submitted and action has been taken accordingly from that date.

Performance in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals

United Nations has published 17 Sustainable Development Goals in the year 2015, with the aim of eradicating poverty through social, economic and political development and protecting the entire environment while moving towards the development goals. These Sustainable Development Goals have been introduced to be specific to each subject area, and the respective goals are expected to be achieved in year 2030. As these goals are related to various subject areas, it is the role of the respective Ministry to prepare and implement appropriate programs to achieve the desired goals and review the progress of the sustainable development goals.

In considering with the functions vested with Cabinet Office, the Sustainable Development Goals cannot be directly linked to the functions of this office. As this office provides the necessary support to obtain all the principle decisions for the control and management of the government affairs, the contents in the Memoranda submitted by Ministries for obtaining policy approvals are checked to see if they are in line with sustainable development goals.
